





## History of PICS at QEHB

- 1,200 bedded tertiary referral and University teaching hospital
- £545million new development opened June 2010
- EPMA across all in-patient beds
  - Not yet in A&E, theatres, dialysis




**Responsiveness**

- Omeprazole and Clopidogrel
- Hypnotics and falls risks
- Hydroxyzine (Atarax, Ucerax): risk of QT interval prolongation and Torsade de Pointes;
- Sofosbuvir with daclatasvir; sofosbuvir and ledipasvir: risks of severe bradycardia and heart block when taken with amiodarone
